

Annual General Meeting

The MCC Real Tennis Section held its first Annual General Meeting on 29 April 2010 in the Committee Room of the Melbourne Cricket Club. A small group attended to support the formal process of electing the committee and approving the annual report and financial statements.

The committee for 2010 comprises Andrew Shelton (Chairman), Iain Buchanan (Secretary), Paul Wheeler (Treasurer), Henry Turnbull and Fred Kininmonth. All positions are honorary.

The Chairman thanked John Faull, a foundation member, for his contribution to the committee and to the Section's activities. John retired from the Committee during 2009.

The Chairman reported on the Section's activities and reminded us that a prime objective of the Section is to promote and foster the game of real tennis among members of the MCC and to represent the interests of those members. The Section also provides an opportunity for members to engage in the wider life of the MCC particularly with events held throughout the year for members of the 11 different sporting sections.

Most of the specific activities described by the Chairman are referred to in this and the previous two newsletters. However little mention has been made of the Section's finances and on this subject the Chairman reported that the Section ended the financial year (31 December) in a healthy financial position. Funds from an original grant of \$10,000 received from the MCC in late 2008 were used for various establishment costs, including the purchase of a set of balls and rackets and to assist with the Club Nights where charges to first time players are limited so as to encourage participation. The section has come a long way since it was incorporated as an association affiliated with the Melbourne Cricket Club. It is now affiliated with the Australian Real Tennis Association, the governing body of real tennis in Australia, and has 73 members with 9 from other MCC sections.

Members' Activities

Our members have been represented in a number of matches and tournaments since the last newsletter.

The World Championship

In pride of place is our world champion, Robert Fahey. In early May Rob met his challenger Steve Virgona at the Royal Melbourne Tennis Club It was Rob's tenth defence of his title since becoming world champion in 1994 when he took the title from Wayne Davies, an Australian then based in New York. Steve Virgona is also Australian, originally hailing from Ballarat, but currently the head professional in Philadelphia.

An account of the match was included in the May edition of the MCC Newsletter and on the MCC website so there is little point in repeating it here but what was not mentioned was Rob's having successfully defended his title more times than any other player in the three hundred year history of the game. Rob's skill and athleticism are remarkable and belie his 42 years. Rob won the match 7 sets to 2 and his play in the final set on the third day was a remarkable exhibition of skill, speed and accuracy.

The World Overs

Several members, including Ian Bull, James Guest, Mike Happell, Wayne Spring, Henry Turnbull and Paul Wheeler, took part in the World Overs held in the UK in April. The World Overs are held every two years and consist of three team contests plus singles and doubles championships.

The team contests are between national teams from Great Britain, the USA and Australia who play on a round robin basis for the Cockram (over 50), the Bostwick (over 60) and the Danby (over 70) trophies. Although Australia has done well in the past this was not our year and we failed to bring home a trophy.

The singles and doubles were another matter and two MCC members distinguished themselves in that Mike Happell won the over 50s singles and he and Ian Bull won the over 50s doubles. Also, Paul Wheeler made the final of the over 70s singles.

The team matches were played at Lord's and the Middlesex University in Hendon while the singles and doubles were played at the Queen's Club. Real tennis is one of those sports where there is a considerable home advantage as all courts have their own characteristics and Lord's and Queen's are no exception. The next World Overs are scheduled to be played in Melbourne in 2012 where it is hoped that Australia will fare better.

This match was played at Romsey on 18 October 2009. It was an enjoyable occasion with some good tennis being played and with one or two close encounters. Handicaps were used with each joust being the first to 8 games.
