# Upcoming events 9 Dec Members and Intro Night - RMTC

#### **Match Results**

**18<sup>th</sup> Sept** - the match against STC started strongly with Wendy W and Tim R winning the first set 8/2, then it went downhill from there with SRTC winning 8 of the next 9 matches, until Robin McA and Robyn W stopped the rot, MCCRTS winning 3 of the last 4 matches. There was some good tennis played throughout the day, with honours with MCCRTS at 9 rubbers to 5.

**4-6<sup>th</sup> Nov** – Festival of Tennis held at Ballarat, teams representing Australian Jesters, BTC, HTC, International Jesters, MCC and Wanderers. Playing for MCC were Rob Jolly, Stuart Strange, Peter Dunn, David Hay, Greg Reid, Tim Raw and Rosie Blanden. With matches a half hour on the clock, MCC finished up winning the event at a 56% win rate, followed by Wanderers, International Jesters, BTC, HTC and propped up by the Australian Jesters. A very festival weekend of tennis with some very competitive matches and the folk at BTC went all out in hosting the event.

#### **Honourable Mentions**

A number of MCCRTS players competed recently in the Australian Masters championships. A number were very successful, Mike Happell, John Piccolo, Wayne Spring, John Faull, Matt Haywood and Allan Willingham all being finalists.

## Membership

We made the decision not to levy membership fees for the last two years due to the restrictions imposed by the Covid regime, however we will be asking members to once again sign up and pay. Subscriptions for 2023 will be \$40 per annum. The membership forms will be available on the website, both for new members and for renewals.

There are a number of benefits, being able to play at or against different clubs more regularly than you may be able to do just being a member of RMTC for example, an additional series of matches, access to MCC functions including Sports Sections Dinner annually, the use of the Hans Ebeling Room and Grand Final lunch at the 'G and more importantly is to have a strong membership base to support the push to include a real tennis court in the potential racquets complex.

### Hans Ebeling Room

This is one of the best kept secrets associated with being a member of the section. You can come to a blockbuster game, get a great dinner and drinks, then go out to your reserved seat on level 2. Non member guests merely need a visitor's ticket to get into the ground and they have will have access to level 2 and the dining room bar, no need to get a balcony pass, if you can get one at all. # **Update on Court Development**
